# A MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER

I'm sure I'm not the only one who couldn't have imagined 18 months ago that we'd still be struggling through the pandemic going into 2022. This, coupled with the incessant onslaught of news reporting that underscores extremes in climate change, human behaviour, and politics, has the potential of creating an end of days state of mind and produces a sense of hopelessness and irreversibility.

At One Girl Can, we see this guite differently. We see a rallying of human resiliency and inventiveness that creates new paths in the face of obstruction. Although many businesses have not been able to surmount this obstruction, many more have found a more relevant and effective way of connecting with their customers and have embraced different approaches.

This past year has been all about exploring different approaches for One Girl Can and finding new ways to be successful. There have been a couple of standouts for us.

The biggest win was our annual fundraiser in June named **BE in KENYA** where we managed to transport our audience to a shantytown in Nairobi. Through the technology of 360° virtual reality filming, our guests were able to walk through the muddy corridors with the girls we're sponsoring, come into their homes to see where they live, and experience firsthand the dangers and restrictions that stand in the way of simply trying to get an education. Through augmented reality, we were also able to build a virtual 3-story dormitory for 72 of our students so that they could have a safe and dynamic environment to complete high school. This was a very different way to present a fundraising event, and we believe the immersive experience was what led to the incredible result we had - \$500,000 was raised during the event and in the week following – a full \$100,000 above our target!

Despite all the hardships and unknowns of the past year, we could not be more grateful for the continual support we've received through donations, in-kind support, and volunteer collaboration. You've partnered with us to build One Girl Can into a stronger and more sustainable organization. Because of your help, we've been able to find new ways of doing things, while also keeping our hope alive for the days when we'll be able to safely plan events and conferences in-person. Thank you for being our support system and encouraging us to keep up our fight against gender-inequality. We are also continually blown away by the resilience of our students. Their stories of triumph and transformation are what keep us going, and we are excited to continue sharing their wins with you.

Secondly, we would normally host a conference in Nairobi each September for 200 university students called **Becoming the Best Version of Me** to introduce them to successful businesswomen who can help further their careers. We were not able to offer this important two-day leadership conference last year because we weren't prepared to fully rely on technology at that point. This year we were prepared, and the entire conference was done virtually. Prominent organizations like Traction on Demand, UBC Sauder School of Business, Deloitte, and KPMG presented high value workshops in their area of expertise, along with several other presenters who spoke on topics like building a workable budget, wellness and safety on campus, and getting prepared for the job market. It was huge success, with 98% of our students tuning in and staying connected for the full three days.

# **PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS**

### Day of the Girl

We recognized International Day of the Girl on October 11 by celebrating your Girl Heroes using #HereForHerFuture. Your girl heroes were your moms, sisters, and daughters. We loved reading every submission we received! It was so inspiring to see everyone come together to uplift the voices of girls everywhere.

### **Giving Tuesday**

To celebrate Giving Tuesday, we partnered with six amazing companies who donated partial proceeds towards our initiatives. We also created a holiday gift guide with gifts that are representative of resources to support our programs. Through this campaign, we were able to complete the washroom facilities at the new Ushirika School.

### **Rebuilding Ushirika School**

After 12,600 hours of construction over 14 months, Ushirika School was completed and welcomed 615 students in January. We cannot thank our incredible community enough for providing our students with a conducive space for studying and a safe environment to learn and grow.

### International Women's Day

We celebrated International Women's Day by partnering with 23 companies including local brands like Kit and Ace, I Love My Muff, and Leah Alexandra Jewelry. Through this initiative, we raised over \$19,000! We are so thankful to connect and work together with strong female leaders in the business world and make a tangible impact.

### Gender Equality School Program

Last year, we created classroom resources and interactive lesson packages for educators in BC to teach students about local and global gender equality issues. This January, it was approved by the BC Ministry of Education and delivered and used by over 400 educators!

### Entrepreneurial Training Program

We know that our work isn't successful until our graduates can earn a meaningful living. In partnership with UBC Sauder School of Business, we launched the Entrepreneurial Training Program. The program aims to give graduates the knowledge and resources needed to start their own businesses and become financially independent.

### BE in Kenya

We hosted our signature fundraiser virtually this year and we had over 423 attendees tune in from around the world. Knowing that it's been a while since we've all left our homes, we wanted to bring the wonders of Kenya straight to our guests. By including 360° immersive storytelling, we were able to transport our guests to Kenya so they could experience what it's like to live a day in the life of a One Girl Can student.





# PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT USHIRIKA SCHOOL AND DORMITORY

This past January, we completed our biggest project yet – rebuilding Ushirika school! We decided to re-build this school after seeing the government close schools in Nairobi that didn't comply with safe building standards. Ushirika could have been one of these, and this prompted us to make a commitment and build a solid and safe school that would stand the test of time.

What started as a rented room for 20 students is now a 3-story building for 615 students. The new school includes 13 classrooms, 2 equipped science labs, 2 libraries, an art room, washrooms with plumbing, and renovated staff rooms and kitchen. This project is life-changing for our students and for the entire Kibera community.

But we didn't stop there. Having a safe, secure, and stable place to live is just as critical to the students' success when pursuing their education. So, we set out on another ambitious project, building the first-ever Kibera dormitory on the grounds of the school.

Ushirika is located in Kibera - one of the oldest and biggest informal settlements in Africa. Living here means facing housing, food, and healthcare challenges that no one should have to endure. Building a dormitory at Ushirika will give our students a chance to pursue their education without having to worry about their safety, household obligations, or other distractions.

Thanks to your incredible generosity at our annual fundraising event and the week following, we raised enough funds to start construction on the dormitory. The dorm will provide beds for 72 high school girls, offer three meals a day, and be a quiet place to focus on schoolwork. Above all, it will provide the security and safety a young woman needs living in a volatile environment.





# Faith






